 - Peaceful Environment of China, Maintaining International Peace;
- **Peaceful Rise/Development: 2004--**
- **Building a Harmonious World: 9/2005**
 - China's World Ideals and Goal;
 - Non-exclusive;

 - The Criterion and Goal of Modernization: Per-Capita Middle Developed Nation (03/\$1000, 06/2000, 10/4300)

 - Creating and Maintaining a Peaceful Environment for Modernization;
 - Maintaining National Sovereignty and Territory Integrity/Unity;
