

Simla Ramphul is the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) Adviser for Migration in Asia.

Prior to her current position, Ms Ramphul was the coordinator for ICRC Protection Department for South Kivu in the Democratic Republic of the Congo; before that she was Protection delegate for ICRC operations in South Sudan and the Philippines. These positions focused on international humanitarian law issues, including monitoring compliance by parties to the armed conflict with their obligations, including the conduct of hostilities, protection of the civilian population and issues relating to persons held in detention.

Ms Ramphul joined the ICRC in 2010 following 6 years of practise as a protection officer for migrants with national government and civil society organisations in France, Australia and India providing social support and legal assistance to the migrants in the community and immigration detention places.

Ms Ramphul wrote academic papers on migration policies with a focus on cultural identities and challenges in migration. She holds a Masters degree in Development Studies of the Sorbonne University, Paris; a Masters degree in Sociology of Social Sciences University in Strasbourg
