Join ISIS Malaysia, UNICEF and SWRC-UM at this roundtable and policy paper launch to explore strategies to expand the fiscal space in the face of Malaysia's demographic challenges.

The roundtable will analyse the fiscal envelope and draw on global evidence and best practices, including funding a social protection floor (SPF) via improved taxation policies and expenditure reprioritisation.

Datuk Prof Dr Mohd Faiz Abdullah Chairman Institute of Strategic & International Studies (ISIS) Malaysia

Farqani's Mohd Noor's background is in economic policy. Having worked with the Social Security Organisation (PERKESO) for six years, he has been researching, advocating, and implementing social-protection policies at the national level. He led negotiations with the Ministry of Finance to implement the wage-subsidy programme to cushion economic shocks and prevent retrenchment during the Covid-19 pandemic.
